Women's Weekend Tour: 6th - 8th August

Leaving Coventry on Friday morning the tour will travel to Upper Boddington and follow the Cherwell valley to Banbury.

On Saturday the Tour will pass through the North Cotswolds through Chipping Camden to Evesham on the River Avon.

On Sunday the Tour will we return to Coventry via Alcester and Bidford-on-Avon. Daily mileages will be about 45-miles and accommodation will be in Premier Inns.

Meriden Memorial Service: Sunday 5th September

The Cyclists' Memorial Service at Meriden commemorates all cyclists' lost in conflict. It is a

national event which, this year, will be supported by cyclists' from the forces and will feature a display of vintage cycles.

As well as it being CTC Coventry's 100th birthday this year it is also 100-years since the first Cyclists' Memorial Service on Meriden Green.

Sadly last year's service had to be cancelled, so this is not the 100th service on the Green, although the vicar, Lynda Lilley produced an excellent 'virtual' service. We believe that during World War II there were no formal services, but it is said that cyclists' still gathered informally.

A number of rides will be departing from the Coventry War Memorial Park from 9am onwards timed to arrive at Meriden at 10.45 in time for the service at 11am .
